Technorama Ulm – The spare parts market in Europa

When Technorama, one of the largest car, motorbike and spare parts markets in Europe, takes place in Ulm on 3 and 4 May 2025, around 800 international exhibitors will once again be present. The halls and every square metre of the outdoor area will be occupied at this very popular scene mecca on the Ulm exhibition grounds. For the more than 20,000 expected visitors, there will be vehicle technology from many brands as far as the eye can see.

Technorama has been an enormous attraction for over 45 years and is a huge treasure trove for classic car enthusiasts, mechanics and collectors and the meeting place for the oldtimer scene this weekend. Visitors enjoy the ambience, the wide range of classic car experts and the charm of Technorama as well as the typical 'vehicle smells' that waft over the trade fair and arouse intense emotions in every motor fan. Anyone who has problems with their fuel supply will find a petrol tap expert for their vehicle in Ulm.

In the Donauhalle, visitors experience a historic journey through time with the presentation of vehicles for sale, which are offered for sale polished and gleaming in chrome. From old Mercedes to nippy Porsches, from classy Lamborghini tractors and Morgan roadsters to VW T2s, many categories were represented last year. A few steps further on, the classic car clubs, societies and IGs provide information about their historic treasures, technical milestones, their travels and activities. This year, the Manta B will be presented in detail and the Mazda Museum will showcase Japanese classics. Spare parts, accessories, miniature models, literature and everything the classic car heart desires can be found in the halls and on the outdoor site. Numerous dealers from Italy will also be there, including with historic racing bikes, Vespas and high-quality original (sheet metal) parts for e.g. Alfa Romeo.

In the rear halls you will find specialists with classic BMW motorbikes, Kawasakis, top restored pre-war machines, mopeds and mopeds as well as Italian brands such as Ducati, Aprilia and Vespa. Fans of historic agricultural machinery will also find experienced exhibitors and can chat about nostalgic topics over a hearty snack at the tractor meeting in Hall 7! The same applies to the classic car meeting with free entry for vehicles built up to 65 as long as space is available.

The opening hours are on Saturday from 9 am to 6 pm and on Sunday from 9 am to 4 pm. The day ticket costs 15 euros, with a discount 12 euros. You are welcome to visit us at www.technorama.de.
